










Hanover Tavern Brunch

1972 Mercedes Benz 280SE 4.5 (W108) The "S" Class Before there was an "S" Class By Kenneth H Brasfield



The year was 1971 and Mercedes Benz needed a family 4-door sedan with a V8 engine to be more competitive in the luxury USA car market. The company already had the W108 chassis introduced in 1965 with the 250 series and finally the 280 series 6-cylinder cars. However, with their European gearing and 6-cylinder engines, many Americans found the car too busy. They also had the W109 chassis, however they were more luxuriously appointed, had a longer wheelbase, and had air suspension, making the W109 a more costly and complicated car. In 1967 the W109 300 SEL 6.3 V8 (M100 engine) was introduced with a strong and positive reception. But this was not the intermediate family 4-door sedan Mercedes Benz USA was looking for. In 1969 the M116 V8 engine (3.5-liters) with Bosch D-Jetronic electronic fuel injection would move the W108/W109 further in many export markets and allow it to be more competitive in the USA. This 197 bhp V8 engine was first fitted to the W109 in August of 1969 and named the 300 SEL 3.5 then to the W108 in July of 1970 as the 280 SE/SEL 3.5.

Due to stricter engine emission regulations in the USA, the high compression M116 was bored out to 4.5-liters to compensate for loss of power from lowered engine compression and named the M117 engine. This engine has the same power output as the M116 but can burn 87 or 89 octane fuel and does not need 93+ octane. It was introduced exclusively for the USA in the Spring of 1971 and production ceased at the end of 1972. However, the M117 engine went on to power subsequent chassis models and continued to be bored out all the way to 6-liters when production stopped in the G-Class W463 in 1991. A most venerable engine indeed.

There were 13,547 280SE 4.5 sedans produced and shipped to the USA from the Spring of 1971 to the end of 1972. Some of these cars are titled as 1973 due to time of delivery.

My car was produced in 1972 and delivered to Colonial Imports, 3450 North Verdugo Road, Glendale, California. It received regular service as documented in the service book I found in the glove box from 1972 (729 miles) till 1980 (76,030 miles). The record stops here and picks up again on 6/28/2013 (117,811 miles) in New Jersey at a vintage car dealership. At that time the records show it received a full service, AC was converted from R12 to R134 with new compressor, complete kit, new hoses and fan belts. It also received new timing chains, timing chain tensioner and guides, transmission service and new shifter bushings. The car was purchased on 11/1/2014 and brought to Virginia. This owner loved and appreciated the car's beauty but was not mechanically inclined and quickly discovered he could not afford to pay for the expertise needed to fully recommission the car. He gave it to his son-in-law in 2018, thinking he had the skills to take the car further and they could enjoy it together. Alas, that did not happen. Let us fast forward to 2021.



I received an email from a friend who was at his landscaper's place of business when he saw a car under a dirty, nasty canvas in a heavy machinery shed covered with red dirt dust. He saw a green wheel cover with what looked like a star embossed on it and asked if he could see what was underneath. Brian, the owner removed the cover. My friend asked if it is for sale. Brian said yes. Brian gave permission for my friend to contact me, thus the email. I telephoned Brian as his place was only about 15 miles from me. I arranged for my wife and me to meet him at his place of business that week. That car was so filthy inside and out but I could tell it was some sort of green and the interior could be cream colored. It was hard to tell through all the mold and mildew. I learned that his father-in-law gave it to him in 2018 because he could not work on it himself and was learning very quickly he could not afford to hire the work done. He figured that since his son-in-law (Brian) was handy with welding and machinery in general he could fix it up. So, there it sat for 3 years collecting dirt and grime because Brian did not have the time, resources, or energy the car required. Also, he knew nothing about the car other than its beauty. Brian felt quite guilty for letting it just sit there and go downhill as he knew enough to know it was just deteriorating from benign neglect. He told me it ran, just barely. I asked if I could look at it in detail and he gave me permission to open it up and explore.

I moistened my finger and carefully wiped away years of crud on a discreet area of paint and was amazed how good it looked. The panel fit and shut lines were excellent. The interior was moldy and had mildew on the upholstery. Nothing shined inside. It had a nasty Sony aftermarket tape player/radio in the dash that did not work. I was reluctant to sit on the driver's seat for fear of grinding in dirt, but I did anyway and got the car started. It ran very rough, but no scary noises came from the engine. The exhaust system was shot but the transmission engaged well and all exterior lights worked. The driver's headlight door was crushed in and full of gravel because he had run into it with his front end loader. He had purchased replacement parts and they were in the trunk. I found service documentation in the glove box and he did not know any of that was there. The documentation was in the actual Mercedes service book that survived with the car along with additional invoices from 2013 to that day. Brian was surprised as I was. This was a very important find as far as I was concerned.

A few days later he drove the car to my place, and we put it up on my lift so a careful inspection could occur. Brian was reluctant to do that because he had not driven that far before and it ran so rough. However, he agreed. When he arrived he said the car ran better the closer to my place

he got. That was an excellent sign. We put it up on the lift and I could clearly see this is a solid car. I could also see some problems but nothing scary. I took it for a short drive and knew this is a solid example that was most likely only in need of some serious reconditioning. We agreed upon a price, and I drove him home in my 1971 280SE.

The first thing I did was completely clean and detail the inside and outside so as not to damage its beautiful finish. That took 3 days. Brian did not know when the car was repainted; he just knew it was that way when his father-in-law purchased it. My guess is sometime between 1980 and 2013 as that is the huge gap in this car's history.


Several months past before I licensed it for the road as it needed a complete run through before I was going to seriously drive it. With its first ever electronic Bosch D-Jetronic fuel injection system married to a totally mechanical ignition system connected by trigger points that actuate the fuel injectors, made for a steep learning curve for me. Before I dove into the mechanical refurbishment I read, read, then read some more. Even then, there were lots of things that needed attention that only became evident to me as I drove the car. One should never be surprised that the vintage car they have just purchased will need items attended to. Many times, vintage cars are acquired by well intended but naive owners. They get in over their heads, don't have the skills or think they cannot learn them, to keep these cars running. Even dealers pass on cars with needs that are known and unknown. Now, the car provides the driver and passenger(s) with that famously sublime W108 experience topped off with that lovely M117 V8 engine. I am just the current caretaker with the responsibility to not allow this quality automobile to fall by the wayside again and to someday pass it along better than I found it.

Silver Star Preservation A Self-Judged Class

This class is for cars, 25 years old or older that are largely original and have been unrestored since new. It is intended for driver- quality cars that have withstood the ravages of time, climate, and daily driving. It is not intended for "Trailer Queens"-for those we have a Show Class- nor is it intended for rusty and dirty barn finds that do not operate properly and have not been on the road for several years.

This classification is designed to formally recognize original cars that meet the defined set of standards by presenting the owner with a certificate commemorating the event and displaying a photo and pertinent data, suitable for framing. It can also add to the provenance of your car whenever one intends to sell or insure it. The certificate awards the owners who have treated their pride and joy gently over the years and have resisted the temptation to restore. As the saying goes," they are only original once" and as we all know, you cannot restore originality!

Your eligible Mercedes-Benz must be entered in a MBCA sanctioned sectional, regional, or national concours. To be eligible, the vehicle must be at least 25 years old, and it should be in good working order, driven under its' own power to the event and be largely original. Your eligible car should have an original engine and drivetrain. There can be partial refurbishments of various components, but no complete restorations can be accepted.



A digital photo of the entrant's car in JPEG format is taken at the show and the classification completed form along with the photo is forwarded to the MBCA National Business Office. National The MBCA Business Office will create and send to the owner an official Silver Star Certificate formally declaring the car to have met the standards of the Silver Star Preservation Class. The owner may also purchase а specially designed grille badge from MBCA National the Business Office.

Cars may be certified at additional shows in

At the event each Silver Star entrant will be given a Silver Star Preservation classification Score Sheet and be instructed how to complete it. The cars are self-judged by the entrant following the form. On the form, the owner informs the judges which aspects of the car are entirely original and which aspects have been altered over time. A Preservation Class Judge, assigned by the Concours Chief Judge will review the completed form with the entrant, evaluating each aspect of the car. If the car has earned enough points to be certified, the Chief Judge and the Class Judge verify the findings and initial the form. succeeding years. We have certified many cars two and three times over the past few years. Though the Silver Star Preservation classification is not yet well known, it is rapidly gaining widespread acceptance. We certified over 80 cars last year and expect to do many more this year.
