Exploring Vinology in Verde Valley during Havasupai 2023

Desert Star Members who attended this Fall's Havasupai '23 weekend were rewarded with an amazing journey through some of most scenic routes, stunning vistas, and charming towns in our diverse state, all while learning about Arizona's little-known wine-making history in the Verde Valley region. Home base for the event was at Cliff Castle Casino in Camp Verde, where participants appreciated the renovated rooms and Breakfast Buffet offered by the now smoke-free establishment. Friday evening's Happy Hour / Welcome Reception was held on the patio of Astoria International Bistro, allowing attendees to get reacquainted while enjoying artisan Charcuterie boards and perfect Fall weather.

On Saturday, the Rallye Route wound northwest through the Verde Valley region. From the Casino, participants traveled along AZ-179 (AKA the Red Rock Scenic Byway) to Sedona, with stops at the Red Rock Ranger Station / Visitor's Center and Sedona Heritage Museum. At the Museum, rallyers learned how Father Kino Eusebio and Henry Schuerman brought winemaking to Arizona beginning in the late 1800s.

Teams then headed southwest toward Cottonwood but were twice diverted off SR 89A – first to appreciate the jutting red-rock cliffs and stunning vistas along Red Rock Loop Road, and then again to wind through the quaint town of Page Springs. Lined with multiple vineyards, wineries, and tasting rooms, this small two-lane rural road led teams to Cornville before heading onto Cottonwood.

Lunch was held at Belfry Brewery, followed by a brief stroll through charming Old Town Cottonwood, before getting back on the road toward Clarkdale and Jerome. The route through these historic towns included more windy roads and scenic views, and ultimately led rallyers to Alcantara Vineyards off SR-260, where they were treated to private tours by one of Alcantara's head vintners. After enjoying the live music and relaxing vibe on Alcantara's grassy vineyard patio, teams completed the route by heading back through Camp Verde to Cliff Castle Casino, where competitors' scores were tallied to see who most successfully matched wits with this year's Rallyemasters.

At Saturday's Dinner and Awards Banquet held in the Casino's Ballroom, rallye teams used corks they collected along the route to help them win prizes during "Wingo," a wine-themed Bingo game designed by the Rallyemasters for the event. Several teams even took home wine donated by local vineyards including Alcantara, 1912, Tantrum, Oak Creek, and Salt Mine. Finally, traditional Kachina dolls were awarded to those teams whose competitiveness, keen observations, and wits best matched the Rallyemasters. Long-time Desert Star members won't be surprised to hear that veterans *Chuck & Ava Stanford* took home the First Place Kachina once again. Second Place honors went to past winners *Ron & Rhonda Borino*, and just a point behind were *Arnie Brown & Matt Crawford* who took home the Third Place Kachina. Congratulations to all the winners!





Mercedes Benz Grande Event in Indianapolis

Rhonda and I attended the Mercedes Benz Grande event this year in Indianapolis driving our 2020 GLS450. What a great time we had as the Grande event did in fact celebrate all things, Mercedes. The Grande is the first event of its kind hosted by the Indiana Crossroads Section, it was put together and pulled off with very few glitches.

The event began the morning of September 7th with opening keynote speaker Al Unser Jr. who shared stories of the only Indy car that featured a new, at the time secret engine that was built by Mercedes. Mr. Unser's lighthearted stories of the engine development, this race and his career held the audience spellbound. If you would like to read more about this race and Al Unser, Jr please refer to your July-August 2023 edition of The Star magazine and the story Won and Done. After the opening address and Mr. Unser's stories he was gracious enough to pose for pictures and autograph The Star magazine with his story in it.

Additional events featured at the Grande included a Ladies of Mercedes fashion show and luncheon held at the famous <u>Columbia Club</u> in Indianapolis. The show was quite nice as several of the ladies from the local section and the club's executive director were modeling outfits for this event. The lunch was served with wine from <u>Adobe Road Winery</u>, an event sponsor, which was just fantastic. There were drawings for some of the clothing too one of which Rhonda won.

The evening event was put on at <u>Mercedes Benz of Indianapolis</u> which featured a new car exhibition and lifestyle experience. Lots of hors d'oeuvres, wine, sprits, vendors, drawings, cars, and camaraderie.

Of course, peppered throughout the day were tech sessions one of which featured a discussion of <u>seat kinetics</u> a feature that was released by Mercedes in 2020. This session described how seat kinetics came to be installed in Mercedes Benz as well as how it works. It was a great presentation and described how this idea was sponsored and pitched to Mercedes Benz Auto Group. Who knew <u>Lewis Hamilton</u> was also a salesman.

The Friday portion of this event included additional tech talks by Airstream and one on how to attract and retain section sponsorships among others. The was an Alzheimer Medallion luncheon at Indiana State Museum which was very well done and explained how the individual sections could become involved. Of course, the Grande would not have been complete without a VIP Lounge and Reception Hullabaloo with excellent hors d'oeuvres, more than enough to make a dinner, drinks, dancing, and a live band. Just a great time with the venue being held at the Crane Bay Events Center in the shadow of the Lucus Oil Stadium.

Saturday included participation in the mother of all car shows. This car show, titled <u>Artomobilia</u> is held in the small community of Carmel, Indiana's Arts District. We had a good time looking at 1000's of cars that attended this event. National MBCA had a tent set up and the featured marque of this event was, well as you might expect, Mercedes. Since we had VIP passes, we got breakfast and again had a chance to interface with all of the Grande sponsors and attendees. Artomobilia was attended by tens of thousands of people.

Saturday evening the Grande's Celebration cocktail hour and dinner was held at the host <u>hotel</u>. Lots of talks, awards, and camaraderie punctuated the evening. The food was fantastic. Probably some of the best beef brisket Rhonda and I have ever had.

Finally, Sunday was a day to try your skills in a racing simulator set up for the F1 racetrack in Monza, Italy and held at <u>Silo Auto Club</u>. There were competitions between attendees and ultimately a championship awarded. Later, the group took a tour of the world famous <u>Indianapolis Motor Speedway Museum</u>.

I suspect that the Grande event will be held next year in Indianapolis. This is a great city and if you decide to go, I encourage you to spend time in the city a day or two before or after the Grande event or both. The city is compact and there is plenty to do as far as visiting memorials, museums, restaurants, dinner, and sport venues, etc. Perhaps a group from the southwest region can plan on attending in 2024.


