Technical Tips and Tricks (TTT)

Buying an Older Low Mileage Mercedes

Something a little different this month... The Memphis MBCA Board Members were contacted by Dylan Essner a Member from the San Francisco Bay Area Section. Dylan was looking to buy a 1986 560SL listed by Smith Imports on **Bring a Trailer**. Selling and servicing Mercedes for 35 years, Smith Imports is respected and a supporter of our Local MBCA Section and we gave Smith Imports a glowing recommendation. Following is my email to Dylan.

"Hi Dylan, Smith Imports supports our MBCA Section, participating with the club in local events, and we can recommend them as a local dealer of Mercedes with an outstanding work shop. I restore older Mercedes and have done ground-up restorations on many. I'm also Certified with Mercedes as a Show Judge, have been a member of MBCA for 30+ years, and I'm VP of our local section. From the videos and photos, the car appears to be well kept in a condition consistent with the low mileage (51K mi). However, due to age and low mileage, it hasn't been driven as much as it's been stored. Here's some things you will want to do after receiving the car:

1. Empty the fuel tank to half full, add a fuel injector cleaner and drive for about 100 miles, then drain all fuel from the tank.

2. Replace fuel filter.

3. Drain and replace engine oil, transmission fluid and filters.

4. Drain coolant and replace thermostat. (caution, check the radiator for leaks)

5. Drain and replace hydraulic fluid for convertible top. (caution with low miles seals may be dry and leak)

- 6. Replace oil in the rear trans-axle.
- 7. Check vacuum hoses for leaks.

8. Replace radio with the original for that year. Visit <u>https://www.beckerautosound.com</u>, They can also add Bluetooth without visual alterations. (eBay is a good source for radios)


9. Use original Mercedes Parts, avoiding aftermarket except where you can obtain the OEM parts.

10. If the paint needs touchup and detailing, consider Black on Black, it's a great show color.

11. Take the VIN number to a local Mercedes Dealer to obtain a service history on the car. It will cover the national database and a little more info you may want to see. Mike"

2023 Greetings From Your Regional Director

The past year has gone by quickly for me as a first-year Regional Director. Sara and I have spent time in November and December visiting some nearby sections for their end -of- year parties and award ceremonies. We really enjoyed all the events we could attend. Unfortunately, illness forced us to miss the St Louis Gateway Section's Christmas Party and I was not able to personally present Rick Siefert, President of the Gateway Section, the Central Region's Officer of the Year Award. Rick has been a great help to me this past year and led his section through -- we hope -- the end of Covid and the untimely loss of two very important members of his section. Congratulations to Rick.

Sara and I were able to visit all eight of the Central Region's sections this year and enjoyed meeting so many members from all over the region. Several of the sections are still adjusting to the end of section rebates and having to find other sources for club revenues. I will continue working with them. One of the most important reasons rebates ended was the termination of MBUSA's \$100K+ rebate to MBCA. So, the 84 sections of MBCA are not the only ones dealing with the end of rebates.

There has been a change of leadership at the top of MBCA. Doug Geganto has taken over as the National President, as Julie Bruggener has finished her two terms as president. Thank you, Julie. We also have a new National Director. Katie Carruth will be taking over the leadership role from Mike Regennitter in December and the official announcement will be coming soon.

Looking ahead to 2023, Doug has some ambitious plans to help the club grow and be more vibrant as a unit of 84 sections working together towards our common goals instead of 84 independent clubs doing their own thing. Doug has already implemented a philanthropic director position to help bring recognition to the sections that work to do service for their community and to encourage other sections to initiate these type of programs. He is also looking to establish a membership advisory board to keep him informed of how the members feel about the direction of the club and any suggestions they might have. Add to that national's efforts establishing marketing and social media offices to help spread the word to Mercedes owners about the benefits of joining MBCA.

As a result, a great deal of effort is being put forth to increase membership and benefits across the whole country within the Mercedes Benz Club of America. The Medallion Rally, in conjunction with the Alzheimer's Association, will become a yearly event to raise awareness of MBCA and at the same time help fight the terrible disease of Alzheimer's. The national event will be moving back to the Midwest and will be held in Indianapolis in October. All of us in the Central Region will be able to help prepare for it and enjoy the many events being planned. I am encouraged by the direction in which we are headed and hope everyone will join me in working together to make 2023 a growing year filled with many fun times and great memories.
