Technical Tips and Tricks (TTT)

Rebuilding the Front Suspension On My 08 E350 4Matic

Lately I've had some challenging problems with my 08 E350 4Matic. Thanks to the City of Memphis Department of Engineering Roadway and Drainage Design, my E 350 experienced major damage to the front suspension from several bad




pothole
encounters. It
was necessary to
replace the front
sub-frame and
motor mounts, as
well as right and
left lower
suspension
struts. This is an
excellent car and

I'm not ready to give it up. It seemed like an easy project... replace the parts and get back on the road. Well it wasn't so easy.

- The new parts were very pricey, so I decided to purchase used parts from eBay. I found a used front sub-frame in New Jersey that looked like new, at 1/3 the cost. The mounting hardware and bushings came from my Mercedes Dealer.
- The front lower suspension struts were no longer available (also known as back-ordered), but I was able to obtain replacement bushings and mounting hardware from Mercedes.
- 3 Mercedes doesn't support using used parts, so I had Carson Frame and Alignment do the work. Carson

replaced the sub-frame and motor mounts and rebuilt the front struts.

While doing this extensive



amount of work, I decided to replace the four worn flex-joint boots on the front wheel drive shafts. Because of the relatively low

miles, I wanted to keep the drive shafts and just replace the boots. Not an



easy task, but we were able to get it done. In total it was a cost of \$3000 and 40 manhours of work. It's interesting how, over time,

we get used to changes in the deterioration of a car and driving characteristics. Following completion of the work, the improvement in handling and drivability was remarkable. I know what you're thinking... why not just sell the car and get a new one. I become attached to my cars and this one is the favorite of all my 12 Mercedes I've owned. I love the design of the engine and suspension and it's just a joy to drive. Sure, the new cars have lots of great features, but repairing and maintaining my favorite car is much less expensive and gives me many more years of driving enjoyment.

Removing UV Damage from Headlights

After many years of trying, I finally found a quick and easy solution to repair deterioration of the headlight clear coat. My 08 E350 was showing a slight hazing in the right headlight and I wanted to fix it.


- 1 Use PlasticX and a soft pad to remove the existing clear coat, After applying the PlasticX, you'll get a dull finish. Don't worry about this, it will disappear once the clear coat is applied.
- Masking off the bodywork around the headlight to protect from over spray, apply 2 coats of Meguiar's Headlight Coating. The first coat is a light tack coat. After 5 minutes, apply a second heavier coat.
- 3 Remove the masking and allow 24 hours to fully cure. If you do get over-spray on the paint work, it is easily removed with rubbing alcohol.

It took 1/2 hour to complete the job from start to finish. I've only used this on light headlight hazing; I've not tried this technique on headlights with severe damage, but it may still work.
