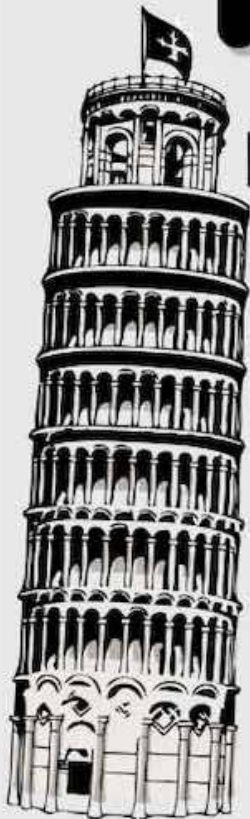

Mercedes-AMG S63

Luxury Carmaker Kicks Off New Year with Powerful Plug-In Hybrid

When Mercedes®-Benz replaced the upcoming 2024 AMG C63's V-8 with a plug-in hybrid setup, some AMG enthusiasts worried about the future of the luxury brand's powerful V-8 engine. Worry not, however, because the new 2023 Mercedes-AMG S63 E will retain its twin-turbocharged 4.0-liter V-8, and will add a synchronous electric motor, resulting in an astonishing 791 horsepower and 1,055 pound-feet of torque. The luxury car missed a year of production, but AMG's flagship sedan is back and better than ever.

The new performance sedan will be able to reach 60 mph in 3.2 seconds, and can top out at a whopping 180 mph. The V-8 engine by itself garners 603 horsepower and 664 pound-feet of torque, while a rear-mounted electric motor makes up the remainder of the



impressive horsepower. A hot-V setup, with the twin turbochargers situated between the cylinder banks, improves the sedan's responsiveness. A belt-driven starter-generator is integrated into the electrical system. The gas and electric powertrains tap into separate transmissions, but the all-wheel-drive sys-

tems allow the e-motor's power to be sent to the front wheels, meaning the S63 can run as an all-wheel-drive electric sedan.

The battery pack has a 13.1-kWh capacity, which equates to a driving range of around 20 miles, and it is situated

above the sedan's rear axle. This motor and battery placement improves weight distribution and handling. For many years, the Mercedes-AMG Petronas F1™ team worked to develop a high-performance battery for its motorsport operations. Now, everyday customers are reaping the benefits of the racing team's efforts when it comes to the new hybridized powertrain in cars like the Mercedes-AMG S63.


The 2023 Mercedes-AMG S63 has seven drive modes. The car starts silently in Electric mode, but engineers

have installed the characteristic AMG start-up sound to be played on the interior speakers. The S63 exclusively uses electric power up to 87 mph before switching over. As the battery's charge is depleted, the S63 will switch into Comfort mode, which balances the two propulsion systems. A Battery Hold mode maintains the remaining charge, while Sport and Sport+ engage the electric motor's power for lively driving. A Slippery mode flattens the torque curve and prevents electric-only driving, and Individual mode lets the driver cus-

tomize the driving setup.

The Mercedes-AMG S63 is able to transform a luxury sedan to a sports sedan depending on the drive mode, thanks to the AMG Ride Control+ suspension system. The sedan lowers by 0.4" when it exceeds 75 mph, and it features active roll stabilization. Plus, standard rear-wheel steering makes the new sedan more nimble in tight spaces and more stable during high-speed cornering.

The new S63 doesn't look too different from a standard S-Class, however it does come with a new grille with vertical slats and a front bumper with larger air intakes. The Mercedes-AMG S63 sits on 21-inch wheels and four trapezoidal tailpipes enhance the rear. Inside, you'll find a luxurious cabin that is reminiscent of an S-Class, but with special AMG upholstery, stitching, seats, and steering wheel. The infotainment systems also comes with specific AMG and hybrid displays.

It's not clear yet what the price tag will be, but interested buyers can expect it to be in the ballpark of \$170,000. Mercedes-AMG is certainly starting the New Year off to an exciting start with this announcement.

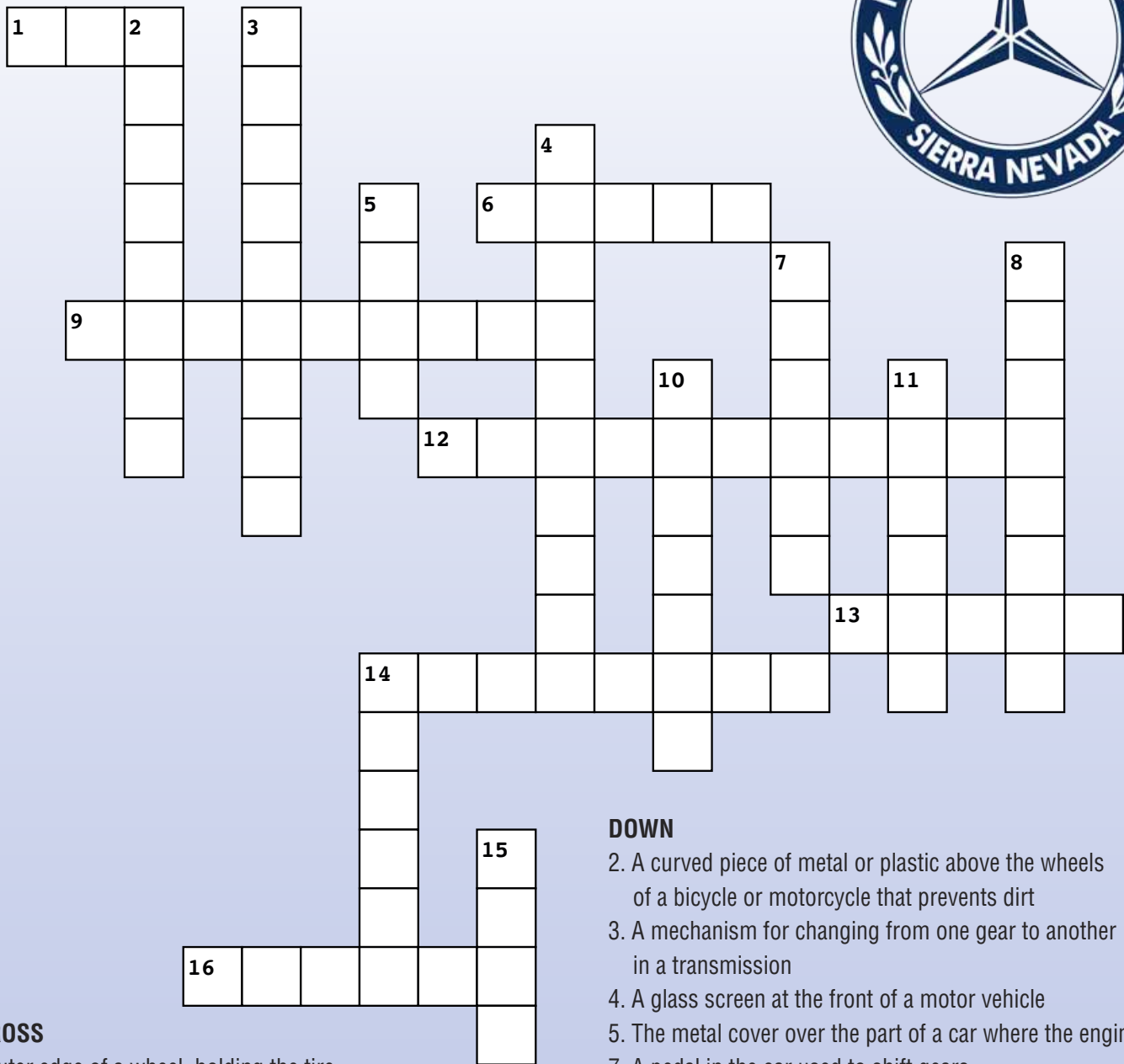

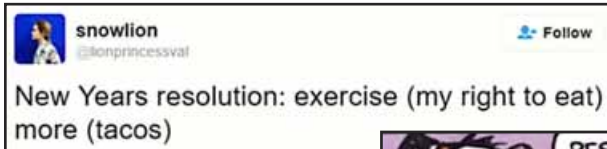
