# **EQE Price Tag**

#### Mercedes Has Revealed Trim Options for All-Electric SUV

n 2022, we reported on the breakthrough new Mercedes®-Benz all-electric SUV, the highly anticipated EQE. The E-class line is part of

Mercedes' plan to electrify its fleet in response to growing demand for electric vehicles worldwide. Well, Mercedes recently released the pricing structure for the all-electric EQE SUV, including its three powertrain options.

The single-motor rear-wheel-drive 350+ model will be priced exactly the same as the dual-motor all-wheel-drive 350 4Matic at \$79,050. This price in-

cludes a \$1,150 destination charge. The EQE 500 4Matic SUV has a price tag of \$90,650, which is \$11,600 more than the 350 models. For this option, you're paying for higher performance, an AMG exterior package, 20" wheels, leather upholstery, and a 10° rear-axle steering system.

The rear-wheel-drive 350+ has 288 horsepower and 417 pound-feet of torque, while the all-wheel-drive 350 4Matic has the same horsepower but 564 pound-feet of torque. The 350+ is going to hit 60 mph in 6.3 seconds, and the 4Matic will get there in 6.2. The 500

4Matic SUV employs more powerful motors, allowing the vehicle to get to 60 mph in 4.6 seconds using 536 horse-power and 633 pound-feet of torque.

These above EQE SUV prices are for the premium trim, but there is also an exclusive and pinnacle trim option. For the exclusive option, customers can expect a steeper price at \$81,150 for the 350 models and \$92,750 for the 500. The exclusive trim adds extra driver assistance options, active ambient lighting, and Mercedes' trick augmented reality navigation.

For the pinnacle trim, it goes up to \$84,750 for the 350 models and \$96,350 for the 500. The pinnacle trim adds a digital light headlight package, four-zone climate control, an enhanced air purification system, head-up display, faster USB

charging, Mercedes' Energizing Comfort infotainment programs, and door light projectors.

Mercedes has yet to confirm whether the EQE SUV will qualify for the recently revised American tax credit, but we hope to know more soon. At the time of publication, Mercedes is not listed as a qualified clean vehicle manufacturer on the Internal Revenue Service electric vehicle manufacturers site. The EQE SUV is going to be built in Alabama, with a locally made battery pack, so hopefully it qualifies soon. Keep your eyes peeled for the EQE SUV, as it's poised to hit dealerships this spring.

Fifty Shades of Gray
Can We Please Bring Back the Shine?

electing a color for your new vehicle is one of the most important choices you make during the car-buying process. You probably have a favorite color, as well as a least favorite. Is your favorite color wet mud, because mine cer-

tainly isn't. Unfortunately for contemporary car buyers, a new style of car paint has become popular in recent years. Muted earth tones in shades of gray, tan, and brown are popping up across manufacturers' assembly lines, and they all reject the shiny, metallic paint that many of us have always loved. When I see a muted pale blue or tan on, what would otherwise be a beautiful car, it makes me cringe. You, too might be asking, what's up with these new, bland colors?

Automakers claim that consumers are drawn to colors that represent harmony with nature and embody a sense of adventure. Beige Jeeps, for example, might evoke a tactical, militaristic feeling. A cream, ecru, or chalk-colored Mercedes®-Benz might have a calming, soothing, natural vibe for another consumer. High-gloss reds, metallic silvers, and

shiny pearl whites have seemingly gone by the wayside, and many of us are in mourning.

It all seemed to start in 2013 when Audi debuted Nardo gray on its four-door RS 7 coupe. Audi claimed it was the first solid gray on the market, and it didn't come with a single sparkle. Jeep released a special color called Gobi, which was a subtle shade of tan meant to emulate Asia's massive desert. Its limited release caused quite a stir, and frenzied Jeep enthusiasts flocked to the dealerships to purchase the Wrangler while the color was still available. For Hyundai, blue stone and sage gray are among the quickest-selling colors out of the many that the company offers. These muted colors still have a shiny clear-coat, but they lack pop or a beep color. It's as if someone added white paint to an existing non-metallic color.

Another paint scheme still gaining in popularity is nonshiny matte paint. The theory about the origin of matte colors stems from the increase in after-market body shop (Continued on Page 14)

modifications. In the late 1990s and early 2000s, car owners were adding body kits and other accessories to their vehicle's exteriors. In order to do this, body shops would spray paint the car with a primer, usually in the color of white, gray, or black, and then a paint

job would be the final step. For some, the matte primer color turned out to be the preferred style instead of a traditional shiny or metallic paint job. A protective, full-body wrap is another way this matte look was achieved during this time period.

Automakers took notice of what was happening after their cars were being sold, and to them it meant that consumers were no longer equating sparkle with excellence. Sportiness and self-confidence were now being tied to (Continued on Page 15)

"I think people are taking a baby step forward in car color choice risk," said Spike Feresten, car collector and podcast host of Spike's Car Radio. "They realize they've been in the big four, black, gray, white, or silver, and they want to try to spice it up a little. So, they take a baby step into chalk."

For the majority of Americans, a whopping 75% of new cars are sold in shades of white, gray, black, and silver. According to Axalta®, a supplier of automotive paints and powder coatings, these muted, natural colors have opened the door to more vibrant colors, too. Also, with the surge in EVs on the market, the green light around the charge port has influenced electric colors as paint options. In fact, Axalta named ElectroLight, a vivid chartreuse, as its 2021 Global Automotive Color of the Year.

perts at chemicals company BASF predict more equilib

rium between natural and synthetic colors in the next few years. Gray has grown in popularity, and coppery brown has emerged as a new trend, too. White pearl and metallic are still the color of choice for luxury vehicles, and this is unlikely to change.

Futhermore, not only are car colors a fantastic way to showcase your own personality, but they can also have an effect on your chances of getting into an accident. According to Kelley Blue Book®, white and silver are the two most popular car colors on the road. Of those two, white has the highest safety rating and is 12% less likely to be involved in an automobile accident than black cars, regardless of the time of day.

The reason behind this isn't anything surprising. White is simply easier to see than black, even in the daytime. In-

the road means a lower risk of being hit. With this in mind, it should be no surprise that yellow has been shown in some studies to be the safest car color overall. Don't get me wrong, there's no way I'd pass on a nice, shiny silver or black paint job for a yellow one.

Sure, chartreuse and hot pink sound fun, but experts and car consumers can agree that what's popular today will not be popular in five years. This means that when it comes time to sell your neon blue Audi or baked clay Jeep, you might run into a hypothetical roadblock. I would hazard to guess, however, that metallic silver and shiny black will make an emergence once again as the most coveted paint colors sooner rather than later. You simply can't beat the elegance of a lustrous, polished-looking vehicle.
