2024 E-Class Camouflaged E-Class Spied on German Streets Ahead of Debut

ur reporter spotted two prototypes of the 2024 Mercedes[®]-Benz E-Class with different grille designs driving in German

traffic in April. The fully camouflaged version had been spotted weeks earlier, but we were able to obtain recent spy shots of the E-Class with minimal disguise.

The Mercedes-Benz E-Class is the German automaker's range of luxury, executive cars. The line is available in a variety of engine and body configurations, and has been one of Mercedes' best-selling models over the past few decades. It was originally available as a four-door sedan, five-door station wagon, two-door coupe, and two-door convertible. For Mercedes consumers, the E-Class marries luxury with advanced safety features, making the car one of the top-selling vehicles for the manufacturer.

The first E-Class was actually a modified W124, and it was debuted in 1993. Over the years, the E-Class Mercedes made major changes to its image, including larger headlights, a longer and wider chassis, and more interior room.



The Mercedes-Benz E-Class was named the *Motor Trend* Car of the Year in 1996.

In the years that followed, Mercedes updated the E-Class with top-of-theline safety features, such as a blind spot monitor, Lane Keeping Assist, Pre-safe with Attention Assist, and Night View Assist Plus. Styling changes and fuel economy improvements further enhanced the E-Class over the years. The fifth-generation E-Class debuted in 2016 and unveiled a curvier, more flowing model. At that time, it was the second-most technologically advanced Mercedes, after the S-Class.

This new E-Class is the sixth generation of the popular line. Beginning with this generation, Mercedes coupes and convertibles will no longer be labeled as E-Class models, and both the E-Class and C-Class coupes will have their own CLE-Class label. This leaves the E-Class with its very own four-door sedan and station wagon as its flagship offerings.

Our spy shots have also determined that the new E-Class has adopted popout door handles from its brother, the flagship S-Class. The car's power will

come from an assortment of four and six-cylinder engines, some being mild hybrids and others part of a plug-in hybrid drivetrain. The AMG version will lose its current twin-turbo 4.0-liter V8 and instead adopt a straight six-cylinder with an electric motor. Rumor has it that Mercedes engineers are aiming for over 700 horsepower and a whopping 884 poundft. of torque.

The new E-Class will have a dazzling display of technological features, including 5G connectivity, AI assistance, and a built-in camera. The interior is described internally as



sporty, high quality, and digital. A high-res gauge cluster and central display affixed to the dashboard will be standard features. A modified version of the Hyperscreen is available, as well as a third screen for the front-seat passenger. A 4D surround system is standard on the E-Class, and there is an upgraded option for Active Ambient Lighting, which adjusts the interior lighting to what the car's system perceives as the mood of the music. This also includes a strobing feature that flashes in sync with the beat. If that sounds too chaotic for you, there's always the more relaxing option of the Mercedes Energizing Comfort wellness program, which includes soothing sounds, seat massage, lighting, and more.

Estimated pricing stands at \$60,000 for the E350 sedan and \$68,000 for the E450 sedan. Our reporters will keep an eye on this developing story and let our readers know when the new E-Class lineup is set to hit dealership floors.



HE MERCEDES-ENZ TYPE 320 TREAMLINE SALOON VAS AHEAD OF ITS IME WITH ITS ERODYNAMIC BODY LONG FLOWING INES.

Type 320 Streamline SaloonAerodynamic Body & Increased Engine Output for Touring Car

n February 1937, Mercedes[®]-Benz celebrated the premiere of the Type 320 at the International Automobile and Motorcycle Exhibition in Berlin. The car debuted a new look for the German automaker, which was a stylized, streamlined body

with sleek lines. The front nose of the Type 320 was a callback to the more angular lines of the cars in the 1920s, but the rest of the vehicle was new and unique.

Many different vehicle bodies were produced for the Type 320, but the standout body style was the streamline saloon. With its shapely rear end, the Mercedes-Benz Type 320 streamline saloon was a forerunner of aerodynamic bodywork design. Nicknamed the Autobahn Courier, the Type 320 was a sight to behold on the new roadways in the 1930s.

The Type 320 was Mercedes' way of bridging the gap between medium-sized vehicles and larger vehicles. With the 3.2-liter Type 320, Mercedes was able to break into the burgeoning larger vehicle class, which already had some steep competition from other manufacturers, including the Maybach SW 38.

This new car was a further development on the existing Mercedes-Benz 290 model, which had been available beginning in 1933. The Mercedes-Benz Type 290 had an M 18 engine that delivered a modest output, but it was a great option for those looking for simple, reliable driving performance. For the Type 320, however, Mercedes engineers expanded on the engine's output without sacrificing the car's handling comfort. It also maintained its vertical valve, six-cylinder pushrod engine.

In order to make the Type 320's engine performance more robust, Mercedes engineers, under the tutelage of Albert (Continued on Page 13)

Heeß, increased the cylinder bore from 78 to 82.5 millimeters. The engine's displacement was therefore increased from 2.9 to 3.2 liters, and 12 counterweights were added to the crankshaft to enhance the car's smooth driving capabilities. The existing simple updraft carburetor was changed to a dual downdraught carburetor. This allowed the car to operate with lower air velocity and larger passages, making it easier for the Type 320 to reach higher speeds and power.

Heeß and his engineers also changed the transmission in the new Type 320. Its predecessor had a four-speed transmission, but it was actually a threespeed transmission system with overdrive. For the new-and-improved Type 320, engineers installed a fully synchronized four-speed transmission system with a direct-ratio fourth gear. This new transmission was praised by consumers and car enthusiasts for its gearshifting comfort.

Additionally, the suspension was readapted for the new, larger car. While the Type 290 had two compensating axle springs, the Type 320 employed dual-action hydraulic lever-type shock absorbers on both the front and rear axles. This greatly improved the driving comfort and handling safety, and it was at the forefront of automobile suspension design for the time.

For its premiere, Mercedes unveiled several different types of vehicle bodies for the Type 320. This included a short-



wheelbase version, a so-called combination coupe that really only saw success as a model for the German Army's kuebelwagen vehicles.

The long-wheelbase version was the successful version of the Type 320 for Mercedes-Benz. The public found the car to be reliable and safe, able to take its passengers on long-distance travels without sacrificing style and comfort. Even one of Mercedes' biggest competitors of the time, Maybach, had glowingly positive reviews of the Type 320.

"When running in idle, the Daimler-Benz engine is considerably better than ours, for it runs absolutely silently," said a sales manager for Maybach, when asked to compare the Type 320 to the Maybach 930 V sports cabriolet. "Furthermore, the clutch pedal is significantly easier to operate. As for the body, the main advantage compared with our sports cabriolet is that the Daimler-Benz motor car allows all the windows to be pulled down completely."

Mercedes vehicles would continue to offer smooth profiles into the 1940s, but the last Mercedes-Benz Type 320 were ouilt in 1942 at the Untertürkheim and Mannheim plants. Between 1937 and 1942, a total of 6,861 of these vehicles were made, with a portion of them being designated for the German Army.


