All-You-Can-Eat Brazilian Feast in Reno

n Brazil, an all-you-can-eat style of restaurant service is called a rodízio. In early September, 25 members of the Sierra Nevada Section

of the Mercedes®-Benz Club of America met at Churrasco Steakhouse for a First Tuesday Dinner, hosted by Christy and Marcus Dodson. Reno's very own rodízio was excited to host our club, and everyone had a great time. Also known as a churrascaria, this evening's dinner included servers that come to the tables with knives and skewers of premium meat. Guests were able to choose which cuts of meat to sample,

prime beef is slow roasted over a Brazilian-style rotisserie grill. The beef selections included: picanha, the prime part of the top sirloin; picanha com alho, or

bite-sized cuts of the top sirloin; alcatra, a special cut of top sirloin; fraldinha, or the bottom sirloin; filet mignon; filet mignon with bacon; beef ancho, or rib eye; and costela de boi, or beef ribs.

Lamb entrees included pernil de cordeiro, or leg of lamb, and costela de (Continued on Page 5)

cordeiro, or lamb chop. These two offerings were perfect for lamb lovers, as well as those that were curious to taste it. They were both seasoned wonderfully and were tender off the bone. Pork options were: costela de porco, or pork ribs; lombo de porco com queijo, or pork loin; and linguiça, or pork sausage. All of these cuts were tender,

savory, and juicy. Chicken enthusiasts rejoiced at their options, which included frango com bacon, otherwise known as chicken wrapped in bacon, and chicken thighs.

Served tableside, the meat was perfectly tender and had amazing flavor, thanks in large part to the rock salt that is commonly used in Brazil. The waiters were so adept at slicing thin layers of the delicate meat that it was almost artistic. The wine list was expansive, and many people in our group chose delicious options to complement the all-you-can-eat meat.

In addition to the tableside meat options, Churrasco had a beautiful spread of chilled fresh salads, hot sides, sauces, imported cheeses, and much more. The buffet included mushroom rissoto, salmon, chicken stroganoff, Caesar salad, mango salad, chicken salad, quinoa salad, potato salad, boiled eggs, assorted vegetables, black beans, jasmine rice, scalloped potatoes, and much more. Freshly baked Brazilian cheese bread, fried banana, fried polenta, and season French fries were served tableside. These delicious options were a great complement to the bountiful meat offerings.

#### 2024 E-Class All-Terrain

#### New Mercedes-Benz Rugged & Versatile All-Terrain Wagon

oes the idea of driving a sleek, four-door vehicle intrigue you, but you don't want to sacrifice the ability to traverse

rugged terrain? Mercedes®–Benz has you covered with it's newly unveiled and refreshed E-Class All-Terrain wagon. Rugged on the outside and underneath, the E 450 All-Terrain Wagon pairs brains with brawn, making it one of the most versatile options on the market.

Just like its sedan counterpart, the new E 450 4MATIC All-Terrain has a fresh, new look for 2024. This high-riding, all-wheel-drive wagon is an ideal choice for luxury car consumers who want to do the occasional off-road adventure but don't want a full-on SUV. Mercedes has a loyal E-Class following, yet this new iteration appears to be an attempt to lure a more adventurous generation to the luxury wagon segment.

The front grille of the E 450 All-Ter-



rain Wagon features two bars with an iridium silver finish in the middle and a revised lower fascia. The standard wheels are 18", although 19" and 20" are available as options. The wheel arches feature dark gray cladding, adding a striking dimension to the overall look of the vehicle's side view.

Outdoor enthusiasts will be happy to hear that the rugged vehicle can hold 21.7 cubic feet of gear or supplies, and can be expanded to 64.6 cubic feet with the rear seats down. A power tailgate and retractable luggage cover come standard. The overall size difference between the E-Class All-Terrain Wagon and the E-Class Sedan is not that large. In length, width, and height, the E-Class All-Terrain Wagon is not more than 1" larger in all dimensions.

A mild-hybrid E 450 4MATIC option is available, which comes with a turbocharged 3.0-liter inline-six engine that puts out 375 horsepower from 5,8000 to 6,1000 rpm and 369 lb-ft. of

torque. The electric boost system provides 23 horsepower and 151 lb-ft. of torque. Speed demons can expect to reach 60 mph in 4.6 seconds, and there's an electronically limited top speed of 130 mph. The wagon has been lifted by 1/2" and a new cladding along the bottom of the car will be advantageous for off-road excursions. A revised ninespeed automatic transmission sends power to all four wheels, and the wagon comes equipped with Mercedes' Airmatic air suspension system, which automatically lowers the vehicle at speeds of over 75 mph to reduce wind resistance.

The All-Terrain Wagon comes with the beloved Mercedes MBUX 14.4" touchscreen infotainment display, just like the sedan version. When in the offroad driving program, the central screen switches over to show a com-




pass, latitude and longitude coordinates, a vehicle angle indicator, and tire pressures. The innovative transparent hood feature that we wrote about last issue is part of the 360° camera's visibility.

The interior of the All-Terrain Wagon is nearly identical to its sedan counterpoint, including a 12.3" digital gauge

cluster tucked behind the steering wheel, as well as leather seats and ambient lighting. Safety is a priority in this vehicle, with attention assist, active brake assist, and a parking package all included in the standard suite of technology. An optional Driver Assistance Package adds active steering assist, ac-

tive lane keeping assist, active speed limit assist, and adaptive cruise control.

Pricing hasn't been released, and interested parties can expect that information to come closer to the car's launch. Customers can surely expect the price tag to be north of the 2023 model's \$71,250 starting price. The official public premiere took place in Munich at the IAA Mobility event, and American con-

sumers can expect to see it hit dealership floors in 2024. Rumors of a pricier, faster Mercedes-AMG E63 variant are swirling, but we will have to wait and see what this lineup reveals next year.



#### Best of Show

#### Mercedes 540K Special Roadster Named Winner at Concours D'Elegance

he Pebble Beach Concours D'Elegance<sup>®</sup> is known as an unmatched tradition of automotive excellence. Since 1950, this show has been the premier celebration of the automobile. In 2023, 216 cars from 18 countries and 30 states

pulled onto the competition field at . At this year's 72nd Annual Concours D'Elegance, a 1937 Mercedes®-Benz 540K Special Roadster was named Best of Show. This amazing vehicle was first owned by the Shah of Afghanistan and is one of just three similar cars in existence. Today, it is owned by Jim Patterson of the Patterson Collection from Louisville, Kentucky.

"This 540K balances strength with sweeping lines and style, and its history is unique," said Concours Chairman Sandra Button. "In talking with Patterson about this car, I was impressed by the time and thought invested in this restoration. Every piece of this beautiful Mercedes-Benz was

researched so carefully to honor its history."

For over 70 years, the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance has been the most important event on the West Coast for au-

tomobile enthusiasts. Visitors and spectators at the show can spot bright green ribbons on a host of cars, which signifies that they've participated in the time-honored tradition of the Pebble Beach Tour D'Elegance. Every year, the Pebble Beach Concours D'Elegance raises millions of dollars that benefit more than 90 local charities. This year, the event raised more than \$2.68 million for charity, bringing the total charitable donations to over \$37 million to date.

Before cars compete for Best of Show, they must first win their class. In this preliminary stage, Chief Class Judges, Honorary Team Leaders, the Chief Judge, the Chairman, and the Chief Honorary Judge cast their votes for the best among the entries. The top three or four who amass the most votes are called to the stage

to be recognized as Best of Show Nominees.

This year, the Best of Show Nominees were: a 930 Mercedes-Benz 710 SS Special Roadster, Auriga Collection, Germany; a 1932 Alfa Romeo 8C 2300 Corto Figoni Cabriolet, care of Gregor Fisken, private collection, London, United Kingdom; and a 1939 Delahaye 165 Figoni et Falaschi Cabriolet, Peter Mullin Automotive Museum Foundation, Oxnard, California.



Keep your eyes peeled around Northern Nevada, as our area had several winning cars at the Pebble Beach event. Steve and Marilee Hamilton of Washoe Valley won the Gwen Graham Most Elegant Convertible Elegance Award for their 1950 Talbot-Lago T26 Grand Sport Saoutchik Cabriolet. A 1933 Duesenberg SJ Weymann Speedster won the FIVA Prewar Trophy, a 1958 Rolls-Royce Silver Cloud I "Honeymoon Express" Freestone and Webb Drophead Coupe won the Class O-4 Postwar (Continued on Page 16)

British Luxury, and a 1958 Ferrari 250 GT Pinin Farina Cabriolet won the Class L-2 Postwar Preservation, all from The Anne Brockinton Lee and Robert M. Lee Automobile Collection from Sparks.

"In Kentucky, we talk about winning the Derby. Well, there's such a thing as winning the Triple Crown," said Patterson. "I've won this Concours twice before today. This is a Triple Crown for me." Prior to this year's Best of Show win, Bugatti and Mercedes-Benz were tied with the most Best of Show wins. This win for Patterson and his 540K puts Mercedes-Benz in the lead, with ten wins in total.
