Annual General Meeting and New Board

We had a successful Annual General Meeting at the Villa Eyrie resort on November 25th. It will allow us as a Section to have a much better vehicle for interacting with each other. That said, it will take considerable work to make it work and James will be taking the lead as our Section liaison with National. The implementation will take place over winter and early spring.

Event Calendar and Upcoming Events

At the AGM there was lively discussion about events. That was followed by an equally lively discussion at our December 11th Board meeting. Our plans continue to include . . . food! We are looking at including more events that include a driving component.















Looking aft, the electric drivetrain on the rear axle.
