
Spring is here, let the events begin!

Overnight Club Trip to Peterborough and Surroundings

Ottawa chapter has had an interesting idea put forward by one of our members for a novel driving event. Because the idea is quite ambitious for our club, as it involves a drive of around 265 km in each direction and an overnight stay, your board of directors is soliciting feedback from members who would be interested in attending this event. The timeframe being considered is August of this year. Please read the description below and email our President at tlang1@sympatico.ca if you are interested in participating. We would like to have all responses by the end of May, so we have plenty of time to make bookings if there is enough interest.

The highlights of the trip are the Canadian Canoe Museum and Peterborough lift locks. Located in Peterborough, the new Canadian Canoe Museum's exhibits explore how the canoe defines the Canadian character and spirit. As well as the canoe collection, the museum features a dramatic waterfall, and a traditional Mi'kmaq wigwam. The museum now holds the largest collection of its kind, with more than 600 canoes and kayaks, and a thousand related artifacts.





Near the museum are the Peterborough Lift Locks. Opened in 1904 and designated as a Canadian National Historic Site, this is the highest hydraulic lift lock in the world. Powered by gravity, the Lift Lock towers almost 20 m (65 ft) above the Trent Canal, enabling lifts in two counter-balanced, bath-tub-like chambers. The locks can be visited, and a 2-hour sightseeing cruise is available as well.

The trip itinerary would start with gathering somewhere in Ottawa's west end in the morning, then driving separately (or in groups of members' own choosing) on Hwy 7 and meeting again for lunch in Kaladar. The next driving leg takes us on Hwy 7 to the Canoe Museum for a visit, followed by individual check-in at our hotel, and a group dinner at a restaurant in the evening. After breakfast the next morning, weather permitting we will visit the lift locks before going our separate ways. Some people will retrace their steps back to Ottawa, while others may use the opportunity to visit Toronto and points west.


