








HIGHLIGHTS FROM EAS OPEN HOUSE & TECH SESSION

Westport Rivers Wine Tasting and Tour



MODAMIAMI 2024

Over the past year there was a schism in the collector car world between Hagerty and RM Sotheby's, certainly not as monumental as the Papal Schism of 1378, but in our small community it was a bit seismic. It is more deeply seated than this, but in summation, Hagerty recently purchased the Greenwich Concours, the Detroit Concours, the California Mille, and more pertinent to this conversation, the Amelia Island Concours. RM Sotheby's was the first Auction House at the Amelia Island Concours and for 23 years it occupied the Ritz-Carlton ballroom, at the heart of the Concours. In 2023, under the second year of Hagerty ownership, the ballroom location was given to Broad Arrow Auctions, a company majority owned by Hagerty. In response for 2024, the owner/founder of RM Sotheby's organized a Concours and auction in Miami, called MODAMiami, scheduled on the same weekend as the Amelia Island Concours. So the question for the 6 months leading up to the weekend was "Amelia or Miami?" Among my friends, it was a 60/40 split, Amelia to Miami.

We decided to divide and conquer: Denton to Amelia and me to Miami. Denton drove down with his friends in the 1985 Mercedes-Benz 190E 16V-2.3 "Carlsson" and participated in the RADwood portion of the show on Saturday. I shipped the 1991 Mercedes-Benz 190E 16V-2.5 Evolution II to participate in the Concours and the Cruise. We also shipped the 1994 Porsche 964 Speedster to Miami for the RM Sotheby's auction, as we were all in on both!

MODAMiami was hosted at the Biltmore Hotel Coral Gables, a place that oozes old school elegance. I was feeling a bit guilty about missing my first Amelia in many years, in fact I was at the inaugural with Hatch & Sons, but a dry martini at the 23,000 sq. ft. pool put me at ease. The Biltmore was completed in 1926 and its design was inspired by the Giralda Tower of Seville, Spain, and upon its completion, made it the tallest building south of Atlanta. In the late 1920s the hotel featured the world's largest pool and hosted fashion shows, galas, golf tournaments, and aquatic shows. So all of our cars parked out front for the Cruise felt just right. The hotel became a hospital in WWII, 1942 through 1968, and what I found hard to imagine is that it was an abandoned property from 1968 through 1986. Thankfully it was revitalized in 1987 and was a fabulous setting for a Concours.

CARS GATHERING FOR THE CRUISE



The Cruise was on Friday, starting at the Biltmore we were escorted by 20 of Miami's finest on motorcycles and with a car full of friends, we were wedged between a 1970 Plymouth Road runner Superbird and 1928 Auburn 8-115 Speedster. Great company! The drive rolled through Coconut Grove with a stop at Vizcaya, the beautiful estate of John Deering, and on to Key Biscayne. It was quite the experience cruising through without stopping for lights, etc., with 29 other amazing cars. The sights, the sounds, and the beautiful weather all made for a great experience.

Our class for the Concours was "Back to the Future", a very competitive class of mostly iconic cars from the 80's and 90's. I knew it was going to be a good weekend though when our assigned class number was P1! The Mercedes-Benz Classic Center rolled out a real heavy weight onto the field, Fangio's W196 Silver Arrow which won the 1955 Dutch Grand Prix. Other highlights included an entire class of Pebble Beach 'Best of Show' Winners including the 1937 Mercedes-Benz 540K Special Roadster. Some of my favorites were the 1935 Duesenberg Model SJ "Mormon Meteor", the 1934 Cadillac V-16 Cabriolet customized in Europe to look French, an all original 1911 Oldsmobile Touring, and a childhood favorite, one of the actual cars used in the movie "Chitty Chitty Bang Bang" that was based on a Mercedes chassis.

As for a first year experience, I thought the spectator numbers were a bit weak and the auction results were 'meh', including ours, but the vehicle selection, the parties, the seafood paella, the swimming pool dancers, the live music, and the Cruise were all first class! Adding icing to the cake, we won the Runner Up Award in our class and earned a drive across the podium. Thankfully next year there is no need for dividing as MODAMiami and the Amelia Island Concours are on opposing weekends.

W140 S-CLASS: HOW DO YOU SELL THE LEAST ATTRACTIVE CAR IN IT'S CLASS?

This is the precise problem facing the Mercedes-Benz marketing team, and their agency when they released the W 140 S-class in 1991. First, let's talk about the car itself. Because there was A LOT right with it.

LOTS of room. Especially in the SEL, where the additional length was devoted entirely to rear passenger legroom.

Environmentally sensitive. Mercedes made sure that the car was asbestos-free (asbestos brakes were being phased out, but not banned entirely until 2003). The wood trim was from tree farms, not tropical forests. And the wiring loom (known to be an issue because its environmentally-friendly design made it more susceptible to becoming brittle and cracking), was biodegradable.

Safe. Refined crumple zones, ABS brakes (which were actually called the Anti-blockier Systeme during development using the W108 platform and later the W116), a driver's-side airbag, and eventually a passenger airbag plus optional seat-belt tensioner. NOTE: From a safety perspective it's worth remembering that this was during a time when small, boxy, not-too-sturdy cars were on sale in the US - the Yugo being one example - having been made from materials as sturdy as Reynolds Wrap.

Amazing engine options. The European luxury horsepower race with BMW and Jaguar had heated up. Jaguar had its XJ12, but when BMW released its 5.0 7-series V12, its domestic German competitor took this as a direct challenge. BMW's direct challenge pushed Mercedes to develop the V12 engine in FOUR YEARS (lightning fast in the world of engine development) for the 600 SEL - the first 600 designation to be used since the 600 Grosser.



W140 S-CLASS: HOW DO YOU SELL THE LEAST ATTRACTIVE CAR IN IT'S CLASS?

Interestingly, this was not the first time BMW had pushed Mercedes in the category of engine development: BMW's silky smooth in-line sixes in the late-80's 3-series pushed Mercedes to develop a comparable "small car" 6 - the 2.6L six released in the W201 190E 2.6.

Interior options. S-class interiors always offered lots of room. This one offered more adjustability in the driver's seat, and typical Teutonic solidity. The center control stack practically sprouted buttons and controls - oozing technical sophistication.

Electronics. Mercedes claimed that the engine management system/ECU module was the most sophisticated ever developed for an engine. Doors were soft closed with a motor that pulled them into their final latch position. Privacy screens could be raised and lowered electrically from the driver's seat. And more!

Styling & design. Here was the Achilles' heel, if you could call it that.

It was big: At 17 feet long, the W140 was approximately as long as a 2024 Ford F150, XLT pick up. Especially in Europe, the W140's size hurt it (ever try parking a 17 foot vehicle on the side of a German Village Road or in the city centers? I drove an Audi Q8 in Germany and Austria, and felt every inch of it's 16 feet while parking). It didn't look like it's predecessors or thoroughbred stablemates. Bruno Sacco had spoiled the luxury car market by designing the previous Mercedes vehicles (the W201 190's (the baby Benz), W124 E-class, and W126 S-class so that everyone knew what the Mercedes "family of cars" looked like.

It was considered angular, boxy and clunky. Words that were not typically used when describing a Mercedes. You see the problem here, right? Mercedes delivered the most sophisticated vehicle ever produced, safer than virtually anything else on the road, with engine options including Mercedes' 1st passenger-car production V12, but it was not a looker. To add insult to injury, the W140's predecessor was not just an incredible car, it was a movie star. You might remember the 500SEL version being featured as the personal limousine of the villain Victor Maitland in Beverly Hills Cop? See the pictures:



I showed the ad to a colleague of mine, who immediately thought "UH OH, my car is too short — maybe I need to get a different one." Mission accomplished.

This kind of marketing didn't turn the W140 S-class into an all-time success, with about 58,000 units per each of the 7 production years vs. the W116's record-setting 68,000 S-class' per year. But in Arlington near where I live, I see a W140 parked in someone's driveway, but I don't see any W126's around.
